that it is also important for the Godly man. Although it is not mentioned in this lesson, it is taught in other scriptures that men should

dress in a Godly manner.

Our lesson refers to modest apparel.

We must realize that 'modest' in one century or era may not be 'modest' in another. We have to realize that the

standards of the society we live in have

much to do with determining what is modest and what is not.

100 years ago, women wore dresses down to the tops of their shoes. Anything above the ankle was immodest and immoral. We find today that such apparel is usually worn only on special occasions. We must ask ourselves what is considered modest in our present society. Regardless of the standards of society there is always a modest and an immodest mode of dress.

Down through the ages, a 'skimpy outfit' have never been considered modest. It has always been a symbol of 'show' and 'seduction'. The Bible teaches in our lesson that this is unbecoming to a woman.

In the period of our lesson, it was easy for the women of Ephesus to array themselves with many jewels on their persons and in their hair. Evidently this attire was being worn to the house of God. Paul is saying that such a 'gawdy' appearance could take away from the effectiveness of these women in the Lord's work. They were bringing more attention to themselves than they were to the work of the Lord.

We realize that jewelry and nice clothes are a part of our society today. We also realize that many formal modes of dress as well as casual modes are not only immodest but immoral. Exposing one's body in public is a disgrace to any woman who calls herself a Christian.

I hope that the young ladies who read this lesson realize that it is not a sin to want to dress and look 'nice', but keep in mind that a person can dress nice without dressing seductive and alluring.

THE LIMITED RESPONSIBILITY

Paul says in verses 11 and 12 of today's lesson that the woman should remain silent in the church. It also says she should not teach or usurp authority over the man.

Paul says in Heb. 6:12, "For when for the time ye ought to be teachers, ye have need that one teach you again which be the first principles of the oracles of God; and are become such as have need of milk and not of strong meat." He is telling them they have not matured in the Lord's work. They are not yet qualified to be teachers. He was speaking to the church and, therefore, was speaking to the women as well as the men.

What does Paul mean in our lesson when he says, "suffer (permit) a woman not to teach"? The two offices of ordination authorized by Christ and given to the church are the office of preacher and the office of deacon. We find nowhere in the scriptures where a woman was ever ordained to either office. Therefore, women should remain silent in these two offices.

When a woman is baptized into the church, she is given all rights and privileges of the church. The offices of preacher and deacon are not rights and privileges of women. They are restricted by the Holy Scriptures. However, there are other positions in the church that are available to women. Women can pray, testify, teach Sunday School, sing, serve as clerk or treasurer or other jobs. There are some committees that are handled much better by women than by men.

If we say emphatically that women must remain silent, we must take away the above mentioned privileges. We have to understand what Paul is teaching and for what purpose.

commended unto the church at Rome that faithful woman Phebe. He also told them to "aid" her in whatever business she could use them. If she were to remain 'silent', how could she carry on the business of the Lord? It appears, from this verse, that Phebe had some designated responsibility with the churches.

IMPORTANCE OF GODLY WOMEN

As stated previously, the world would be a pitiful place if it were not for Godly women. Phebe, mentioned in our Memory Selection, was one of many recorded in the scriptures. Women have always played an important part of teaching the principles of God in the home. Hannah, mother of the prophet Samuel, prayed that if the Lord would give her a son, she would return him to the Lord. The Lord gave her a son, and Samuel became one of the best known judges and prophets of Bible times.

God chose a virtuous woman named Mary to be the mother of Jesus. The Mother of Moses was responsible for raising him in the nuture and admonition of the Lord although he was raised by Egyptians.

Proverbs 6:4 states, "A virtuous woman is a crown to her husband; but she

that maketh ashamed is as rotteness in his bones." Proverbs 31:10 says, "Who can find a virtuous woman? for her price is far above rubies." A woman can be an honour or a disgrace to her husband, family and church.

The Lord's church is referred to in the feminine gender. It is referred to as the bride of Christ. The first church at Jerusalem is referred to as the Mother Church. In speaking of Christ and the Church, Revelation 21:9 says, "And there came unto me one of the seven angels which had the seven vials full of the seven last plagues, and talked with me saying, Come hither, I will shew thee the bride, the Lamb's wife." This shows us the importance the woman plays in the work of the Lord.

As recorded in Genesis, the woman was given to the man as a help meet. She was not to be superior or inferior as far as importance. The man was given the rule over all things because he was made first. Each has his own designated obligations before God. This is the reason some tasks mentioned in the Bible were given strictly to men while others are given strictly to women.

SAVED IN CHILDBEARING

The statement that Paul made "she shall be saved in childbearing", has a much deeper meaning than what many people think. There is a doctrine today that teaches a woman will be saved if she dies while giving birth. Knowing that there is only one plan of salvation, childbearing not being a part of it, let's see what is really meant.

The first man and woman never knew each other intimately until after they had transgressed God's law and took of the fruit, then knowing good from evil and becoming separated from God. When God brought their sins into the open, he told the woman that she would bear children and replenish the earth. Genesis 3:16 says, "Unto the woman he said, I will greatly multiply thy sorrow and thy conception, in sorrow thou shalt bring forth children; and thy desire shall be to thy husband, and he shall rule over thee."

New people and new generations were born. After several generations, Jesus was born by the Holy Spirit through the childbearing of the virgin Mary. This is the childbearing that Paul was referring to.

Any person who has or ever will be saved is because of the childbearing of the woman. If Jesus had not been born into the world, all of us would be without any hope in the world. Therefore, you must understand that in childbearing (birth of Jesus) all can be saved.

I trust that all of you will take this lesson into account and study it more. Study all of the Godly women in the Bible: Space would not allow discussion on each in this lesson.
