SAVED PEOPLE'S RESPONSIBILITY

(Continued from last issue)

When we wholeheartedly humble and consecrate ourselves meekly in the Lord's cause, maybe lost people will weep on their knees as little children in humiliation and agony of sinsickness. They cannot see inside of our sympathetic heart but bodily and speaking worship, when spiritually led, motivates a lost person to feel worried in helplessness and could be just enough incentive for initiating sinners to take inventory of theirselves as hereditarily depraved.

Society is made up of various backgrounds and cultures of people who haven't seriously thought about God's grace. Are saved people lacking spiritual cooperation in our Lord's visible kingdom? I Thess. 5:19; Eph. 4:30. My brothers and

sisters, pray that we shall not feast upon hid goodness and mercy until watching unaware. "And that knowing the time, that now it is high time to awake out of sleep: for now is our salvation nearer than when we believed." Romans 13:11.

Encouraging someone else in the right way is securely intact in the wages of heaven's great books. Nonetheless, if and when we fail to creditably warn others who don't know God triumphantly in the free pardon of sin, we'll lose their presence in heaven if they're not saved before dying, which would be losing their priceless inheritance. Unless the world can see fruit of our profession, we could enter heaven without invaluable accompaniment. Hurt and pain may compose our weary vision. Yet, God's fair recompense is unprejudiced. God will richly reward his deserving children and penalize those Christians who haven't remained submissive for heaven's enjoyment and possessions, instead living to lust after and accumulate this world. TIBERIAS ON SEA OF GALILEE



TIBERIAS (tī-bē'rī-ās, Gr. Tiberias), a city of HERRAS (H-bern-as, Or. Hoerias), a city of Herod Antipas, built between the years A.D. 16 and 22 on the western shore of the Sea of Galilee, or the Sea of Tiberias, as John, writing for non-Jewish readers, calls the lake (John 6:1; 21:1). It was named, of course, after the reigning emperor, It was named, of course, after the reigning emperor, Tiberius, reflecting the pro-Roman policy consistently followed by the Herods. The city is said to have occupied the site of Rakkath, an old town of Naphtali, and since Rakkath means "strip" or "coast," this may have been the case. Jewish rumor said Tiberias was built over a graveyard, and the place was therefore dubbed unclean (Josephus. Ant. 18:2:3). Macalister is of the opinion that this proves that no earlier city occupied the site (HDB p. 934), but Herod could easily have included the burial-place of Rakkath in his larger foundation. Herod built ambitiously. The ruins indicate a wall three miles long. There were a palace, a forum, and a great synagogue, for the foundation illustrated strikingly the dual Herodian policy, which sought to combine pro-Roman loyalty with faction with proved. which sought to combine pro-Roman loyalty wine effective patronage of the Jews. Jewish boycott, however, compelled Herod to populate his new town with the lowest elements of the land. Defended by its strong acropolis, Tiberias survived the passing of the other lakeside towns. Saladin, who took Tiberias in 1187, was unable to reduce the citadel until after Hattin. The hot springs and baths lay S of the city wall.

NEW YORK/AMMAN Evening departure from New York on your jet to the Evening departure from New York on your jet to the Holy Land. A hearty dinner and breakfast are served aloft. It is the only river in the world which flows for most of its length below sea level. Lunch in Jericho. Dinner and overnight in Tiberias.

Day 4 TIBERIAS/CAPERNAUM/TABGHA/ MT.OF BEATITUDES/MAGDALA/CANA/ NAZARETH/CAESAREA/MEGIDDO

You take a boatride on the Sea of Galilee from Tiberias to Ein Gev. Continue to Capernaum and visit ruins of ancient synagogue and a Byzantine Chapel at the site of Peter's House, then on to Tabgha, place of the Multipli-cation of the Loaves and Fishes, Mt. of Beatitudes and Magdala, home of Mary Magdalene. Drive to Cana where the first miracle of Jesus took place and then to Nazareth where you see the Church of the Annunciation built over the Holy Family's home, Mary's Well, Joseph's Carpenter Shop. Continue to Caesarea, built by Herod the Great in 20 B.C. Here Paul was imprisoned for two years until he was sent to be tried in Rome. Stop to explore the Crusader Fortress and the Roman Theatre and continue to Megiddo and visit excavations and tunnel. Dinner and overnight in Tiberias.

Day 5 TIBERIAS/QUMRAN/DEAD SEA MASADA/BEERSHEBA/HEBRON

Drive along the road by the Dead Sea, through the Jordan Valley to Qumran to visit the caves where the Dead Sea Scrolls were found. You stop at the site of Ein Gedi where David spared the life of King Saul. Continue to Masada, the Palace-fort built by King Herod. In 73 A.D., 960 Jewish zealots committed suicide here rather than surrender to the Romans. The heights are attained via cable car. After descending, exhilarated by the breath-taking view, a short drive is made to Beersheba, the southermost city of Israel in the Old Testament. Here Abraham made a covenant with Abimelech. Continue to Hebron to view the cave of Machpelah where Abraham, Sarah, Isaac, Rebekkah, Jacob and Leah are buried. Dinner and overnight in Jerusalem.

Day 6

JERUSALEM/BETHLEHEM/
MT. of OLIVES/GETHSEMANE
This morning you spend getting to know "Jerusalem the Golden." text is arguing against the authority of God which causes suffering and sorrow. "How shall we escape, if we neglect so great salvation. . ." Heb. 2:3.

God has demanded that the world be evangelized with the gospel of His Son. God called me to preach and I cannot understand why or how anyone could refuse such a burden as I've had since then. "How then shall they call on him in whom they have not heard? And how shall they hear without a preacher? And how shall they preach except they be sent?' Rom. 10:14-15.

Along this journey of sweat and tears, if we feel a broken heart and heartaches, Jesus always intercedes for us when we pray our lowest prayer and earnestly worship him.

HONOR AND PRAISE THE LORD

Our family and friends, kindred and acquaintances are the blessing to our Lord's spiritual help. God has bountifully bestowed me with liberty to attend church. When a person is saved, the establishment of salvation in their soul is anchored steadfastly and afresh with God's special touch by the Holy Spirit.

Our deep uneasy pangs and scared solitude in rough storms of life cannot save anyone. Each saved person who won't emotionally break down and fervently plead to God for help, needs reviving. "For I am not ashamed of the gospel of Christ: for it is the power of God unto salvation for every one that believeth . . ." Rom. 1:16.

It can't be overemphasized that the power of God over temporary life here is calling for revivals, prayer meetings and upbuilding of local bodies of our Lord's churches. It is also our job to casually discuss the gospel in our regular affairs. "Beloved, when I gave all diligence to write unto you of the common salvation, it was needful for me to write unto you, and exhort you that ye should earnestly contend for the faith which was once delivered unto the saints." Jude 3.

My brothers and sisters in Christ, as we press onward toward that final, happy goal of crowning excellence, may we cordially offer our best dutybound help to replenish those poor and, or sick, but most importantly, always warn the unsaved, led by the Holy Spirit anxiously as chances permit.

We must stay totally responsible for lost souls who are at stake; my fellow Christians; tried but resisting temptation; hurriedly devoted as we ask; explain whenever and wherever possible; serve as an example, by God's conquering help we'll proclaim the gospel NOW as a positive reminder to sinners.

I would like for you to remember my loved ones who have already been saved; my mother, grandmother, sister, brother, step-grandmother, great uncles, great aunts, uncle, cousins and other family members and acquaintances. For those who have not told me they were saved I would ask you to help me pray for them. They are my father, some great uncles and great aunts, cousins and other family members and acquaintances.

SUMMARY OF THIS ARTICLE

The reference made in Part 1 is to explain that "repenting of unbelief' automatically, and in the process of doing so, covers all sins of the person involved and NOT teaching that a sinner has to repent of any sin except for the sin of unbelief in order to be saved by the grace of God. By, in, and when repenting of the sin of unbelief, a sinner is saved and released inwardly from all his or her bodily (outward being) sins even if he or she has no knowledge in his or her life in this world of having ever sinned (all people sin outwardly) in any way EXCEPT for being lost because of UN-BELIEF!!!

When a person becomes old enough to feel lost (usually as a young boy or girl) he or she (YOU?) will be lost unless God saves the soul of that person. But if that person dies unsaved, he or she will go to, and stay in hell eternally!!! Has God ever saved your soul? Every sinner in the world would turn to God if they knew how much that they need him and how bad that hell

No person has, is, nor ever must without own self-choice be made to die unprepared!! Not a single one!!! Decide to make it right with God and don't quit trying until you do!!! Any sinner who is living in this world can be saved NOW!!!, if that person will turn himself or herself over to God!!! Don't hold back.
