THE POOL OF COMMUNIST BETHESDA

Pictured at left is the Pool of ' Bethesda (John 5: 1-9) which lies a few yards from St. Stephen's Gate inside the walls of Jerusalem. At the time of Christ it was just outside the northern wall of the city. It stood near the Sheep Gate which led into the Temple. It was a meeting place for invalids as its water had healing properties (John 5:4).

The Pool is sacred to Christians since here Christ healed the man who had been crippled for 38 years (John 5:7-9). The Pool, buried under debris for hundreds of years, was recently in great part unearthed. It was found that the Pool was rectangular in shape "about 350

THEDEAD SEA

Nearly 1300 feet below sea level, the Dead Sea is the world's lowest point. It is actually a 'dead end' sea, for the giant lake has no natural outlet; water entering by the Jordan, flashfloods or underground springs, can only leave by evaporation; thus, salt concentrations build up enormously. Its high salt and mineral content (ten times that of seawater) makes the Dead Sea one of Israel's most valuable natural resources. Potash, magnesium and bromide are extracted by a process known as selective evaporation. The waters are also known for their curative powers against skin and muscle diseases.

feet long by 200 feet wide by 25 feet deep' surrounded on all four sides by porches and divided laterally by a 5th porch. This confirms the words of St. John who described the Pool as having 5 porches (John 5:2).

One of these pools was used for the washing of sheep brought to the Temple for sacrifice (John 5:2).

B. Get control of all means of publicity, thereby:

C. Cause the registration of all firearms on some pretext with a view to confiscating them and leaving the population helpless.
