One cold February day of 1952, I met a foreigner on the street of Yamaguchi City, an old historical city of over 1,000 years, located in west part of the Honshu, main island of Japan, who was a young single American and a Baptist missionary to Japan from middle Tennessee by name of J. Frank Carr. He was a different type of man compared with uniformed American soldiers and officers came to occupy the incendiary shell bombed ruins of Japan with General MacAuther after the World War II. This gentleman dressed in suit and hat, on a bicycle, spoke to me, "Come to my Bible Class" in English. THE KNEE ROUTE WAY

As we review this slogan that is often used by us all, we encounter many questions. Realizing its usage is with good intentions, yet often it is left beside itself and deception is still possible. I personally found life and salvation with my knees to the floor, yet there are still others that were saved on their back, on their front (or face), standing up, sitting down, and other positions. So the condition or position of the body is irrelevant, yet the condition or situation of the heart of a person is essential to obtaining salvation. The Lord told Samuel that he seeth not as man seeth: "for man looketh on the outward appearance, but the Lord looketh on the heart." (1 Samuel 16:7) (see also Genesis 6:5) "For I (am) the Lord, I change not." (Malachi 3:6). So the Lord still has a clear view of man's heart, focused solely on the intermost being of a person.

There are many modern organizations that still allow the sinner to kneel in their search for salvation and promote "A" knee route way. Through their process of dealing with those bowed, a voice or whisper is heard by the seekers ear, asking questions, quoting promises and reading scripture. 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
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EDITORIAL NOTES

MINISTERIAL SUPPORT

PART 5 - WHAT SYSTEM?

How shall we afford a supported ministry? What system shall we use to collect the needed funds? Perhaps no aspect of this subject has been so controversial as this one. Any method which will fulfill that which God has ordained by providing adequate support for the ministers who preach the gospel and labor in the word and doctrine is satisfactory, if it be within the guidelines of the Holy Scriptures. It is agreed among us that the expenses of the churches should be met by the donations



of the people of God. If all of us would ask God each week the amount we should give, as earnestly as we ask other knowledge of him, and obey his promptings, there would be an adequate supply so that the gospel would not be hindered. However, this method of collecting "free will offerings" does not seem to work very well when the church is not as spiritual as it ought to be.

Most men, especially in this age of free spending, need some type of system in order to save a few dollars even for their own use. Few people are able to save anything without one. Yet we

************* persist in the impractical course of allowing each person to give spontaneously of what happens to be in his pocket at the moment his heart is moved. In many cases there is nothing to derive the Lord's portion from when the Spirit does grip the heart. It is all spent.

We have an excellent pattern for a system of giving laid out for us in the Old Testament Bible. Many diligent Baptist people have looked to this system as a guideline in the regulation of their voluntary giving of their offerings to the Lord's work. They were not compelled by the church or the ministry to do so. The system of tithes and offerings is a practical one which if made to fairly fit the ways of our modern life does well as a method of giving. However, at the mention of tithing, although it be left voluntary to each person whether or not to use this method, we have had many able ministers to rise in opposition to this or any plan of proposed systematic giving.

The New Testament instructs each church member to give "as God hath prospered him" (1st Corinthians 16:2), "according to that a man hath" (2nd Corinthians 8:12), and "every man according to his ability" (Acts 11:29). These scripture passages all agree that the giving is to be proportional to the prosperity of the giver. Too often in our churches it is not that way. The rich among us should give the most. That is the purpose of their riches (1st Timothy 6:17-19), though there be but few rich men among us. We are all well aware that some could more easily give twenty percent of their income than others could part with five percent of theirs. When it is done as it should be, the wealthy will give far more than a tithe, while some of the poor might have to look to the church for assistance. Yet this inequality of wealth should offer no excuse for withholding from the Lord, for it was Him who richly praised the poor widow who cast in all that she had.

We are also instructed to "lav by in store," "upon the first day of the week" (1st Corinthians

hell than before. (see Matt. 23:15) What instruction can be given after a sinner has heard the true way of salvation that comes through repentance and faith, and is diligently, sincerely, convicted, hearted, contritley, seeking to be saved? When a sinner is seeking with all his or her heart to be saved, turning from satan, the world and self, trying with all the soul, mind and spirit to trust in and rely upon a living savior, would a human whispering voice in that sinner's ear hinder or help toward salvation of the soul? What is the purpose for having a place set aside for sinners to come to? Is it for instruction or prayer? I sincerely feel the bench is set aside for sinners to seek the Lord and not a place for instruction. Don't misunderstand my position, a lost person needs to be instructed, they need to hear the testimonies of God's people, but they don't need it whispered in their ear while bowed in humility reverancing God, crying out from the heart for mercy. When you consider a man in water over his head, unable to swim, in his struggle to survive, he will grab a straw to sustain himself. True Baptists offer no straws to those drowning in sin. We offer only a sure tried foundation, which is Christ Jesus. I want everybody to be sure that they are building on the right foundation. Merely being on your knees is not enough, if so salvation would be of works and not of grace. Jesus told Nicodemus (see St. John 3:1 thru 8) "Except a man be born again, he cannot see the kingdom of God", he went on to say, "The wind bloweth where it listeth, and thou hearest the sound there of, but canst not tell whence it cometh, and whither is goeth: so is everyone that is born of the Spirit." True Baptists' settle for nothing less for membership, neither will God at the Judgment. We must be born again (or from above) which is an ISOLATED PER-SONAL EXPERIENCE between the seeking soul and God. Godly sorrow or penitence must be so great, that every thought not relative to finding soul salvation is stripped away. Repentance cannot take place while the mind is thinking about worldly pleasures or sorrows.

CHURCHES THAT GUARD THEIR MOURNERS BENCH, GUARD AGAINST DECEPTION. In order that the Gospel might continue to be preserved in purity for our children as well as others, we must not yield or sub-

mit even for a moment. (see Galatians 2:4&5). A good sister told me of how her father (who is a Deacon, large in stature) was very protective of his family when they were seeking the Lord. Standing guard directly behind them, with his legs slightly apart, arms folded across his chest, as though he dared anyone to trespass and hinder them from finding genuine salvation.1

We desire and see to it that the True way is preached, guarding our pulpits against error. Likewise we should protect our mourners bench from becoming a bench of deception, making sure the True Way is practiced. No doubt there are some cases in our churches where a confession is made with the mouth, without a change taking place in the heart, wherein the confessor deceived themselves. When a sinner is prompted by the work of a deceiver to make a false confession at the place set aside in our churches, then that church stands responsible before God for this deception. The Lord knows what is being done, he knows what is not being done, and what is allowed to take place in his church. (see Rev. Chapter 2&3)

COACHING IN THE NEW TESTAMENT CHURCH. I don't believe anyone truly saved would intentionally deceive someone that is lost. Yet we are not as cautious as we once were. The Spirit of the Lord leads or impresses God's children from time to time to say something or testify for the advantage of a lost person, which is scriptural as in (Psalm 107:2) let the redeemed of the Lord continue to say so. (also see Acts 20:21 & Eph. 4:30). When we have done all we can do, we need to (or must) wait upon the Lord. Let's not be impatient or over zealous and try to coach a sinner into salvation. The Gospel of Christ is the power of God unto salvation to everyone that believeth. (see Romans 1:16) The Gospel, when enpowered by the

my life completely later on. I was 17 years old and was a 2nd-year-high school student of the city.

My father, Teruichi Tajima, was a normal type of man of that age, who was honest, deligent and faithful to the traditional religions of the land handed down from fathers for over 2,000 years. My mother, Oshizu, was a quiet woman as her name meant. They had 6 sons and a daughter between them, which was a common number of family in those days. I was the fourth son born July 6, 1934, or in the 9th year of our Emperor's reign. Before the war started against China my parents and their four sons moved to the city from Wakayama with some other relatives to promote Japanese laquerware business. It was a good time with the business. My grandmother, Oyuki, who lived with us, used to take me out to those Buddhist temples or Shinto Shrines. She would give me something good if I could memorize some of big Buddhist long and hard sutras when I was a small boy. She would proudly show the guests to the house and say, "See, he is smart, isn't he?"

After the war got jammed in China, and even after 1940 with America, our business got down and a small income with it. Two of my older brothers were taken to the army, and one went to the navy, and we did not know where they were: we did not know if they were alive. One of my uncles died somewhere in the Pacific by the attack of American submarines. Our house in Wakayama was destroyed by the bombing. My grandmother died with cancer without good medical treatment just before the war ended. Then my mother died with a kind of muscle inflammation, which is as nothing today, but was fatal to her because of her malnutrition. She was looking forward to get a shot of penicilin known as the latest specific medicine, provided by Red Cross Hospital in Tokyo, for which we paid 500 Yen, same amount of a-month-living cost at that time. She died before the penicilin arrived. It was when I was 11 years old. All three of my brothers came home alive, got married, and left home. I was the one to take care of young brothers and sister. It was a dark time to any one of the land, but the after-war reconstruction was being carried on to get back the lost social systems and orders.

I visited Bro. Carr's Bible Class, which was used to be held in his rented room in the Eifukuji Buddhist Temple. (It is strange to say, but it was true. Gospel of Christ was being preached in the heathen house of paganism. Some time later he got a rented house in Dosocho of the city, to which he moved and started a mission till he organized a Baptist Church.) There were several people. A man of mid 40's was the interpreter. A clerk in the registration office by name of Harada, a university student by name of Hamano, were there with some other people. I kept attending the services, but soon I got disappointed. There was no intellectual satisfaction in the knowledge I got there. It was same old story of Jesus crucified on the cross of Calvary. Repentance and faith in the Lord Jesus. It seemed I had heard the same sermon every time I attended. But I kept attending because it was the only place I could have living English. My father, my old brothers and their wives encouraged me go and get good education there believing it would help when I got upper education in university.

One day in June of 1952, it was after attending his services four months, missionary J. Frank Carr told me he was praying for me. He told me he was praying for my salvation, salvation for eternity in the Lord Jesus. It really touched my heart. It also reminded me of a time that I heard him praying in big and loud voice reached the way I was walking along one spring night. It was the prayer that I heard by chance, which was an earnest prayer like burning fire.

Since then I began to look into my soul. The Holy Spirit was working on me all the way since I was born, no, even before I was born, but I did not realize it. It was He that brought me to the Truth, not me. I came to realize I was a sinner and I needed to get saved. Lord told me I had to repent of my sins and trust Him as my only Saviour of the world. I didn't know how. I hadn't seen anybody saved before my eyes, hadn't

THE MEANEST **MOTHER IN** ALL THE WORLD

Have you ever heard the story of the meanest mother in all the world? Well, let me tell it to you, for it happened to me.

I had the meanest mother in all the world. Other kids had candy for lunch, but I had to eat soup and sandwiches (with whole wheat bread). Supper was different, too. Vegetables, fruit and sometimes prunes - ugh! I wasn't the only one who had this mean mother - my brothers and sisters had her, too.

Mother was so nosey. She insisted on knowing where we were at all times. "Who are your friends?" "Where are you going?" "When will you be back?" You won't believe it, but we had to be back the very time we said we would be back. It was like having a ball and chain around your leg. When we didn't do what was right, she would actually strike us (I'm ashamed to admit it); and not just once, but just about every time we disobeyed. Can you imagine actually hitting a child just because he disobeyed? Now you can begin to see how mean she really was.

The worst is yet to come. In bed at nine - up at seven. Man, we never even got to watch the late-late show. We couldn't sleep until noon like a lot of our friends. If you have never heard about the child-labor law, you and my mother would get along fine. It was work all the time. Wash the dishes, make the beds, cut the grass, learn to cook and all sorts of cruel and inhuman things. She and Dad must have lain awake at night just thinking up chores for us to do.

Here's something you just won't believe. Mother sounded like a judge for we always had to "Tell the truth, the whole truth, and nothing but the truth"...even if it killed us, and sometimes it nearly

When I was twelve, I really thought my mother was about the dumbest thing around. But by the time we were teen-agers, she was

16:2). The Lord gets his first. He has always demanded the firstfruits of our substance; and be our offerings money, time, energy, or whatever else, God does not accept the part left over as a sacrifice well pleasing unto him. He expects the first and best that we have.

Opposers of systematic giving often say, "Every man according as he purposeth in his heart, so let him give, not grudgingly, or of necessity: for God loveth a cheerful giver." (2nd Corinthians 9:7) I am afraid that often while that rule is followed many give practically nothing. Paul, in this verse, was already aware of the generous intent of the brethren to whom he was writing. This intent they had "purposed in their hearts" as much as a year before. (See 2nd Corinthians 9:2) Many seem to reason that it is better not to give at all than to give "of necessity," but certainly no such ill logic as that is found in the Bible.

I think it reasonable to suppose that any of our Baptist families who have good fortune and a comfortable living could afford a tithe (ten percent) for the Lord. They would be well rewarded for so giving if it would be a willing sacrifice. Each Baptist would profit from the exercise of keeping account one year of the amount given to the Lord that he might examine his own deeds to see if he has in truth given "according as the Lord hath prospered him.'

Paul was not ashamed or afraid to refer to the temple worship for his example to justify ministerial support from the offerings brought by the people as a sacrifice to God. He asked, "Do ye not know that they which minister about holy things live of the things of the temple? and they which wait at the altar are partakers with the altar? EVEN SO hath the Lord ordained that they which preach the gospel should live of the gospel." (1st Corinthians 9:13) The gospel ministry is to be sup-

ported by the offerings of the church just as the Levites were supported by the temple offerings. Paul made that comparison. "And behold, I have given the children of Levi all the tenth in Israel for an inheritance, for their service which they serve" (Numbers 18:21), said the Lord, and again "But the tithes of the children of Israel which they offer as an heave offering unto the Lord, I have given to the Levites to inherit: therefore I have said unto them, Among the children of Israel they shall have no inheritance." (Numbers 18:24) We are also shown by example what happened when the Levites were not awarded the portion that God gave to them: "And I perceived that the portions of the Levites had not been given them: for the Levites and the singers, that did the work, were FLED EVERY ONE TO HIS FIELD. Then contended I with the rulers, and said, WHY IS THE HOUSE OF GOD FORSAKEN? And I gathered them together and set them in their place. Then brought all Judah the TITHE OF THE CORN AND THE NEW WINE AND THE OIL UNTO THE TREASURIES." (Nehemiah 13:10-12) Likewise, when the gospel ministry is not given the portion God alotted it. it will be found that the ministers have fled every one to his field (or job) and the question is in order, "WHY IS THE HOUSE OF GOD FORSAK-EN?" The Levites comprised a twelfth part of Israel. God made a plan whereby the tithes and offerings of all Israel would adequately keep up the house of God, and its ministers on an equal level with the rest of Israel. It was a practical one. It worked then, and it will work now also. God designed it. Although the New Testament ministers are not commanded to take tithes of their brethren as the Levites were, the apostle Paul has clearly placed the example of the Levitical ministry before the churches with reference to the support of the gospel ministry. It is an interesting exercise to approximate the ratio of the family mem-

seen any example of that kind in any form, hadn't heard it in my life. I was heavy hearted. It was an important time that I was in because Satan was challenging to take me to dangerous circumstances. There was a struggle in my soul what to do with the matter: to flee away from this heavy hearted condition, or to go through. More I heard the gospel, the more Satan disturbed. I was almost dead. Satan whispered to me go back to that peaceful Buddhism that was handed down from loving fathers, that historical tradition and heritage, but the Lord was calling me come. and surely He was.

The truth says, "...ye were not redeemed with corruptible things, as silver and gold, from your vain conversation received by tradition from your fathers; but with the precious blood of Christ, as of a lamb without blemish and without spot."

July 18th of the year I visited Bro. Carr personally with tired and worried heart. I was almost dead. I knew I had to do something. He and I kneeled down on the floor. He asked me plead for remission of my sin repenting it all. He encouraged me praying by my side. Humbly he did. Honestly I did. I trusted in Him as my only Saviour of the world. There were a lot of sweat and tears on the floor. The Lord saved my soul that summer afternoon. He set me free from care and uneasiness. He set me free from Hell and lake of fire eternally. I got saved wonderfully that afternoon, and was filled with great joy and peace that I had never had before. All these came from heaven. There were great tears of joy.

I brought it home and told my father all about my experience I had from the Lord that afternoon. In the beginning he listened to me quietly. But soon I realized he was so mad and angry by his expression on his face. He knocked me down. He told me I was deceived by that foreign devil. I was too young to have right religion by my young experience of life. I would understand it when I would reach 40 years of age. He told me that christianity was a wicked religion of the world. I knew how Spanish Catholic missionaries and priests came over to Japan 400 years ago and what they did. I knew why the Japanese government of that time forbade it as a wicked and dangerous religion, and how hard and cruel persecutions were upon those Catholic followers, and Japan closed its door to any foreign countries for 300 years since then. But that was a different thing with me. He told me all kind of thing for me to get away from what I got from my heavenly Father that afternoon. But I could not change it.

Since then he called his family members and his relatives many a time what to do with this careless, silly, brain-washed, stupid, thoughtless, non-Japanese, polluted, non-respected hearted for the honorable ancestors, and foolish son. Everybody opposed me strongly at a time, and pleaded to me to abandon it for the better mutual relationship and for the better blood-ties of our own at a time. I had a hard time, but I tried to avoid fussing with them. I believed it was not of the Lord. After several days of family conference, they decided to cut all the relationship with me and my family and to kick me out of all family ties. I had mixed feeling: I was sad with all the reactions of my father and family to the right thing everybody must have with the Lord, yet I was happy with the Lord. I loved them all. It was true.

I soon realized what Jesus said in Luke 12:52-53 was real. "Suppose ye that I am come to give peace on earth? I tell you, Nay; but rather division: For from henceforth there shall be five in one house divided, three against two, and two against three. The father shall be divided against the son, and the son against the father...". His words were ringing in my heart. "If any man will come after me, let him deny himself, and take up his cross, and follow me" (Matt. 16:24). "Verily I say unto you, there is no man that hath left house, or brethren, or sisters, or father, or mother, or wife, or children, or lands, for my sake, and the gospel's, but he shall receive an hundredfold now in this time, houses, brethren. and sisters, and mothers, and children, and lands, with persecutions; and in the world to come eternal life." (Mark 10:29-30).

much wiser, and life became more and more unbearable. No tootin' the horn out front for us to come running. Can you imagine, when we went out on dates, our friends had to come to the door to get us? Speaking of dates, while our mature friends were "hotrodding it" at 12 or 13, our old-fashioned mother refused to let us date before we were 15, and then it had to be those old "group dates" at some church activity. She said we needed more experience.

As a mother, I think mine was a colossal flop. None of us have ever been arrested or beaten up on each other. My brothers all served their country and received honorable discharges. We each have deep convictions of right and wrong and have found a productive place in society. And whom do you think we have to blame for the terrible way we turned out? You're right our mean mother. Look at all the things we missed: We never burned buildings or took part in a riot. We didn't smoke pot, we didn't even call the policemen "pigs". We didn't even get to burn our draft cards. She somehow managed to force us into God-fearing, educated, honest-to-goodness adults.

Now when my son or daughter comes around, and in the struggle of the moment calls me "mean". I just lean back, smile, look up and say, "Thank you, God, that when I was coming up, I had the meanest mother in all the world!"

bers of gospel preachers to total church members in our associations and churches today. Considered as a whole that ratio is remarkably close to the one twelfth ratio of Levites to Israelites. I would not quarrel with any brother about the subject of tithing. I would only ask in light of the facts here presented, "How much would be required of each church member to support the Lord's work in keeping with that which he has ordained?" Voluntary tithing would certainly provide the required finances.

One of the greatest deterrents to generous giving to support the gospel has been the saying, "God doesn't need your money." HE never has! HIS ministers are the ones in need, and God has ordained HIS money, not yours, to support them. What you withhold from God of his due you rob from HIM. I believe that God would instruct each church member what to give if he would seek God's will in prayer. I also believe that in general the combined amount of offerings in all our churches would be sufficient to support the gospel ministry. God is a God of providence; and surely he will not instruct contrary to that he has ordained.

Most of our worthy preachers would be willing to go on indefinitely, warring at their own charges, if they believed that it was God's will for it to be so; but when they feel torn continually between two legitimate responsibilities, neither which can be fully met, they have a burdensome life which no man and family should be subjected to. It appears that most of our churches which have met the responsibility of supporting the ministry are the same ones which contain a considerable number of members who are convinced of their obligation to give at least a tithe of their increase unto the Lord. God bless those who willingly offer this acceptable sacrifice!

I had no where to go. My dead mother's brother had a little understanding with me and was in sympathy with me. I had some appearance of his dead sister. His company in Osaka was destroyed while the war was going on. He started a store of cloth and fancy goods after returning from the Navy. He took me to his store, where I opened it at six in the morning and closed it at eleven in the night, seven days a week. I was out of it except school time in the beginning.

September 17, 1952, I was baptized by Baptist baptism in a river of Yamaguchi into the fellowship of Plunket's Creek Missionary Baptist Church, Smith County, Tennessee by Bro. J. Frank Carr with the authority of the church.

I was very sorry when I heard my father had gone bankrupt and left his own house with desparated heart. It was after I left home. Since then I had a few times of meeting him; on each time I testified to him of the Lord Jesus and he seemed to think himself deeply. Last time I met him was 20 years after he kicked me out. He shed his tears as he was listening to me. I was telling him that old same gospel of Christ on the cross of Calvary that I first heard from Bro. Carr when I was 17 years old. He was becoming senile a little bit, but he was clear in mind. I was happy he got saved. It was a long distance for him to have blessed salvation. When I heard he died, I cried a lot, but was happy because he had a home up in Heaven through the Lord Jesus Christ.
