REPORT FROM JAPAN


Dear Elder Benny Maggart;

for my wife and I it is a spiritual reality.

My first objective when we arrived here was to try and find a sound Baptist Church, or one that at least preached the true way of salvation. While doing extensive research, we met a lot of people through attending different local assemblies that call themselves Baptists. This is what I believe the Apostle Paul did using the synagogues of the Jews to introduce people to the truth. A few of these assemblies gave me an opportunity to preach. Then a door opened in East Hampton. There, a small group of people were meeting together in a quonset hut about sixty miles east of where we live, on the verge of disbanning. They needed a preacher to fill their pulpit. Permission was granted from my home church, Fellowship Missionary Baptist Church. Seven Sundays I preached to a total of twenty one people at this location. At the present time only God knows the results of this endeavor.

To give the reader of this report a shadowed glimpse of what we are up against, I submit the following analysis; So called Baptists in New York City are sympathetic with the homosexual movement, and even practice ordaining them into office of pastor in their churches. On Long Island, they invite anyone, regardless of denomination or age (by that I mean children as young as 3 yrs. old) to eat at their communion tables, using saltine crackers and juice. They accept anyone's baptism as long as it's immersion. They train their members to use a type of sales pitch which they use to win people over to their ways. Children as young as 4 years old are being decived. Sermons, and yes even some prayers are simply read while the congregation stands. Mimes, magicians, comedians, and other worldly entertainments are being used as the latest ways of preaching the gospel. Religion here is very vain, with the word Baptist carrying little meaning and many bad reports.

In closing I would like to thank everyone for their prayerful support and pray you'll be well blessed in the year 1986 as we labor together with God.

Petty's class of South Carthage has never forgotten to send us American foods for many years, with which we cooked Christmas dinner for our people and their families. Our son Luke and his family in St. Paul, Minnesota, sent us a box.

Both Michiko and I are fine and are doing fine for the glory of God here in Japan, for which we are thankful. We finally got well from the flu that bothered us a lot. We had extremely cold weather with snow and ice past several weeks, however, it is getting much better now. We are looking forward to have Spring. Our daughter Kyoko got back to school in Kobe second week of the month. We miss her. Right now she is having final exams for the academic year. We hope she will make them all right, then she will be sophomore in April.

We appreciate those people who have given us the invitation to come to the States many a time. We really do. We know to be with blessed missionary Baptists in the States for some time will be totally an inspiration for us to keep on the work for the Lord in the land of Japan, yet we know Lord will not allow us to leave the field at this important time.

Three years ago a young American boy visited Japan and stayed in his missionary friend's as a tourist, and he got an idea to become a missionary while staying in Japan for fame and gain. He applied for the missionary visa to switch his status at the Japanese government. He was rejected, and had to get out of the country. Then he asked us for help with the letter of guarator. I asked him if he was saved, if he was baptized into fellowship of a local visible Baptist church with right vote and by right authority, if he was called to preach, if he was ordained by right order, if he was called as a missionary to go out through a New Testament church, and if each step was properly taken at his church, etc. His answers were not satisfied. I said to him, "Why don't you do right?" He left Japan.

This man, age 26, got married in the States then, and they came to Japan last May with tourist visas, because they could not get missionary visas in America. While staying in Japan they have applied for the visas, and were rejected each time they did. Recently by the great help of the Lord we have found the conspiracy made behind the curtain with them and our church clerk to make a mission organization in order to give them the credit, and they did nominal one, with which they applied for the visas, and were rejected. They must have whispered something sweet to the clerk's ears to get him out of us on purpose. This excluded ex-clerk must have been sponged enough by them. We have to keep our eyes wide-open and earnestly contend for the faith which was once delivered unto the saints.

Two of the five major Shinto Shrines of Hiroshima Prefecture, national and traditional religion for over two thousand years, had hundreds thousand worshippers for the new year three days ceremonies and sold a great number of protection papers, arrows for fortune, and many other things like that kind, got fire and burnt down at each different mid-night. This was interesting to us the saved by the blood of Jesus Christ. The Lord says to us to stay away from idols.

We are holding our services in pretty good shape, for which we are thankful. Sunday of the week two new children came to our Sunday School. One of them was brought by her father, and the other came with other children by city bus. A gentle old woman also came to our preaching service, who had never been to any service of any church in all her life. She said she would come again as she got a great impression by hearing the truth preached from Bible. We hope so and she get saved. We would like for you to pray for Mrs. Yoshida, a young mother with baby; for the Nozzus, a young couple with two small children; for the Itsukuma brothers, age 22 and 20, who come to us by train that takes over an hour from Iwakuni. These requests are for their salvation of the Lord. We ask you pray for others who

need more faith to live among the heathen people in this country. Please pray for us. We will keep praying for you all.
