My family and I are fine and doing fine for His glory, for which we are thankful unto the Lord. My children came down with the new type of flu a few weeks ago. They really suffered from high fever, headache, and throat trouble for a while. Right now they are quite all right. Michiko and I didn't catch it, so we could keep doing the Lord's work. We praise the Lord.

Many of you have asked me about our living in this land. It has been said that Japan is the highest country of the price on the earth for some time, and the prices have been lifted month by month, week by week, and even day by day, like fury. Shortage of oil, paper, sugar and others spur inflation, as wicked merchants take advantage of these confusions. The price of propane gas will be raised twice the month. The price of train transportationwill be raised 30 percent up next March and so forth. I would like to say something here. Our God is not dead. He is real to His people. It is true that He takes care of His children. It is true even to us, the least of them. He has supplied all that we needed always and made us possible to carry out the Gospel of Christ to the lost in this land of paganism. In fact, we have paid all the bills and nothing was left to be blamed from the enemies of Christ last month. We praise the Lord. We depend on the True and Living God.

Last Sunday we had a sweet and wonderful time. A young man, 19 years old, Hirosawa, got saved at Koi Church. He has been coming to our service nearly a year. He has been in our hearts and prayers since then. Every time when I say to him, "Repent your sin, and trust the Lord Jesus Christ as your Saviour", I don't see him for a while. He guits coming. He hasn't given me his address. He is such type of people who are afraid of being seen or known to his people that he is going to be christian people. I knew he was under conviction. When he appeared again a few weeks ago, I taught him very clearly God's plan of salvation. He invited me come to his house. Last Sunday morning he got saved and showed himself publicly that he belongs to the Lord. It was by His powe

There are still such old fashioned Japanese. When I was in Wakkana Hokkaido, last October to conduct revival at Baptist Bible Church, I realized a young man was sitting on the back seat. Wakkanai is the town on the very tip of northern Japan. You can see Sakhalin, Russian Territory, through Soya Straight, when it is fine. I took five different trains and a ferry boat to get there. After two days trip I arrived at that windy and fish-smelling town on the coast of the Sea of Okhotsk. Bro. Larry Hagen and I worked to win souls. There are souls to be saved also in that desolated area. That fellow came to hear me every night and sat down on the same bench. He held his arms, closed his eyes, bowed his head slightly. He was not sleeping. He was listening to me carefully. That is the old fashioned pose of Japanese. He didn't show his emotion. His face was just like a Japanese wood-carved mask, though he had a mustache. Right after the service, he went away without saying anything. I knew God was drawing him toward Himself, not to each of us. Last service came; he came forward telling he got saved. There are several people who got saved during the meetings. All of them were saved by His saving power. We only know we are His servants.

We will keep praying for you all. We would like for you to pray for us. May God richly bless you.
