# **CHRIST BEFORE THE COURTS**

Christ was arrested about midnight after He had gone to pray in the garden of Gethsemane. Judas Iscariot identified the person of Christ. They were sure some of the disciples would be with Him, and they wanted to get the right man. So Judas stated he would kiss the man called Jesus. Christ submitted to the kissing of Judas and then said, "Betrayest thou the son of man with a kiss!"

He was led through the streets of Jerusalem by Roman soldiers, to the house of Annas, who was called an high priest as well as Caiaphas. It was not lawful to try persons at night. Annas that night sent Jesus bound unto Caiaphas, the high priest. The law of Moses said you must have two witnesses to every fact. At last there came two witnesses who testified that Jesus said he would destroy the temple in Jerusalem and would rebuild it in three days. Both of them lied. He never said that! He did say He would destroy this temple and rebuild it in three days. He was speaking of His body, not the temple of Jerusalem. He was put on oath before God by Caiaphas – I adjure thee, tell us whether thou be the Christ, the son of God. Under this most judicious oath Jesus acknowledged that He was God's Son. Here it is – "Jesus said unto him, thou hast said, nevertheless I say unto you, hereafter shall ye see the son of man sitting on the right hand of power, and coming in the clouds of heaven." (Matt. 26:64) Our Lord was saying, I am God the anointed One, to be the Prophet, the Sacrifice, the Priest and the King, and He swore that He was. When he had given that testimony, the high priest rent his clothes. The law required that whenever they heard a blas-

phemy they were to rend their clothes. If Jesus did not tell the truth, it was blasphemy. But our Lord told the truth. If He didn't we are in our sins and every sermon ever preached was a lie.

Jesus was carried to Pilate. The charge against Him was blasphemy. His trial was the first held before the Jewish Sanhedrin. The penalty for blasphemy was death by stoning. Since they didn't have the power to put people to death, they had to bring the case before the court of Pilate. As they came before Pilate they presented three new charges against Jesus. First charge - He says that He is a King. Second charge - He teaches that Jews should not pay tribute to Caesar, and the third charge was - He stirreth up the people. After Pilate had finished his investigation and heard the people, he said, "I find no fault in this man." Then, Pilate sent Him to Herod, and Herod sends Him back to Pilate. Now Pilate's wife had been warned in a dream about the innocence of Christ and she sent a message to her husband while on the throne, "Have nothing to do with that just (Continued on Page 2)

They took Jesus, therefore, and He went out bearing the cross for Himself. Deprived of sleep and food He was so physically weak He was unable to carry the cross all the way. They beckoned to a man of Cyrene, Simon by name, and he carried the cross. The Jewish day begins at six o'clock our time. So Jesus was nailed to the cross at the third hour or nine o'clock our time one morning. The cross was dropped into the socket between two malefactors (thieves or robbers). What a proverb that has become - "Crucified between two thieves." On the way to Golgotha Jesus spoke these words, "Daughters of Jerusalem, weep not for me, weep for yourselves and for your children."

Now let's think of His trial before the court of God for the charge of sin which included the penalty of death, both physical and spiritual, and let's think of His trial before the court of hell on the charge of sin with the penalty of passing under the power of Satan and so becoming the prey of the Devil. Psalm 22 illuminates the events surrounding the cross of Christ and we hear Zechariah say, "Awake O sword, against my shepherd, against the man that is my fellow, saith the Lord of hosts: smite the shepherd, and the sheep shall be scattered." While hanging on the cross, Jesus cried, "I thirst." From the sixth hour until the ninth hour darkness prevailed over all the earth. This was not an eclipse of the sun. They don't last that long. It was devil darkness. As Christ said, "This is the hour of the power of darkness." In those three hours occurred the greatest tragedy earth ever knew. What were the constituent elements of the horrors of that darkness? In the first place, whoever enters into that darkness is forsaken of God. Out from that darkness we hear the cry, "My God, My God, why hast thou forsaken me?"

From the sin of Adam to the close of the judgment scene, no man ever entered that man. I have suffered many things this day in a dream because of him."

But the chief priests and elders persuaded the multitude that they should ask Barabbas, and destroy Jesus. Barabbas was a man guilty of murder and a robber. Pilate then asked, "What shall I do with Jesus which is called Christ?" They all said unto him, "let him be crucified." Pilate then had Jesus crowned with thorns, put a purple robe on Him and brought Him out before the people and said, "Behold, the man!" Pilate took water and washed his hands before the people saying, I am innocent of the blood of this just man: see ye to it. The people all cried out in mockery, "His blood be on us, and on our children." Pilate didn't crucify Jesus but his sins and ours did. Christ stood that day before a host of judges, but the day is coming

signed the death warrant for Jesus of Nazareth, whom he had twice acquitted. darkness until God forsook Jesus. And why should God forsake Jesus? What had He done to separate Himself from God? The loneliness that comes from being God-forsaken is the most terrible loneliness in human experience. I think, when God forsook Jesus, it meant spiritual death. Physical death is the separation of the soul and body. Spiritual death is the separation of the soul from God. The second element of that darkness was penal in that the one who enters it is smitten by the sword of divine justice. "Save me from the sword," said Christ in prophecy, and the Father answered, "Awake, O sword and smite him." Why should the sword smite Jesus? It smited only sinners. Jesus was holy, harmless, undefiled, and separate from sinners. Jesus was born holy. Jesus kept every

precept in spirit and letter of the divine law. In Him was no guile! How, then, could the

sword of divine justice smite Him? "God

The third element is, that it was not only penal, but it was sacrificial. When a sinner brings a lamb and binds it to the altar, and then confesses his sin on the lamb and the innocence of the lamb is accounted to the sinner. Then the robed priest, without pity, sinks the sacrificial knife through the heart of the lamb and catches the hot blood and carries it into the holy of holies, and sprinkles it upon the mercy seat to make an atonement.

In that darkness, atonement for sin was made once for all. If Jesus died the death of a sinner, he must also suffer pains of hell. David said, "The pains of hell gat hold upon me." What are the pains of hell? Let the rich man's testimony stand. "Forasmuch then as the children are partakers of flesh and blood, he also himself likewise took part of the same that through death he might destroy him that hath the power of death, that is the devil." At the end of the three hours of darkness, Jesus cried with a loud voice, then said, it is finished. He had met the Devil in head to heel contact bruising the Devil's head while suffering a bruised heel from the Devil. While Jesus was crushing the serpent's head, he felt the bite of the serpent and could not help but cry out with a loud voice. The most horrible thing known to man is for a lost soul to pass under the dominion of the devil. Men may deny there is a Devil, but they will meet him and will enter darkness over whose portal is written - He who enters here leaves all hope behind. Thank God for Jesus Christ our eternal Redeemer!

- 10. Salvation by Grace through Faith in Christ God's grace entitles, enables and enlivens the sinner to the new life in Christ.
- 11. Justification Before God by Repentance and Faith Without Any Admixture of Works "Not by works of righteousness which we have done, but according to his mercy he hath saved us."
- 12. Separation of God's Children from the World "Ye shall know a tree by the fruit it bears."
- 13. Water Baptism (Immersion) to be Administered to Believers Only and by Divine Authority as Given by Our Lord to His Church.
- 14. A New Testament Church is a Local, Visible Body of Baptized Believers Observing the Great Commission.
- 15. The Lord's Supper is a Church Ordinance, as is Baptism, and is to be Adminis-

tered to Baptized Believers in Scriptural Church Capacity Only.

- 16. Eternal Security of the Believer Harmony of God's preserving the believer in Christ with the believer's persevering through faith in Christ.
- 17. Establishment by Christ of His True Church During His Personal Ministry on Earth That Christ took saved and baptized people, and thus organized them into a little government with His Word as the only Law and Himself as the only Lawgiver.
- 18. A God-Called Ministry God impresses the hearts of some saved men to devote their lives to prayer and ministration of the word of God.
- 19. Worldwide Evangelism was Given by Christ to His Church We are debtors to carry the glorious gospel to every creature on earth.
- 20. Perpetuity of the Doctrines of Baptist Churches from the First Advent of Christ Until His Second Advent—Though the Lord's true churches have gone by names given them by their enemies in other days, they have always been known by their doctrines.
- 21. That All Scriptural Churches Should be Held as Equal Units as to Their Rights and Privileges in Associated Capacities No big or little churches with one lording authority over another.
- 22. That All Associational Assemblies are Servants of the Churches.
- 23. That We Brand as Unscriptural: Open Communion, Alien Baptism, Pulpit Affiliation with Heretical Ministers, Unionism, Formalism, Universalism, Campbellism, Catholicism, Charismaticism, Pentecostalism, Deism and All Other Religious Philosophies of Men.
- 24. The Personal and Bodily Second Coming of Christ.
- 25. The Bodily Resurrection of the Dead, Both of the Righteous and the Wicked.
- 26. The Reality of Heaven, with Divine Assurance of Eternal Happiness for All the Redeemed of God.
- 27. The Reality of Hell, with Everlasting Punishment of the Incorrigible Wicked.

Loyal service as a member of the true church is the saved man's duty to God. I have actually heard Baptists make the statement that one Church is as good as another. We would probably be shocked if we knew how many Baptists believe this, whether they would say so or not. Many of us are saying it, by attending or permitting our children to attend all these so called churches over the country.

Who is at fault for this attitude among our people? I would say first that it is the fault of Baptist parents. What have we taught them? Maybe, we have taught them that once they are saved, that is all the Lord expects of them and they can do as they please after that. Maybe we have taught them that the Church is not very important anyway. Have we taught them maybe without meaning to, that it is more important to make a living, or rest, or visit or go fishing on Sunday than to attend Church?

Maybe our children have heard us say that just a few people run the Church anyway, so what is the use of me trying to do anything. Maybe the Lord and His cause is not discussed in our family conversations. Then there are those who don't want to be the interfering parent, so we will let them choose their own Church.

Parents, you had better guide your children to the right Church. If you are not thoroughly convinced which one is right, it is your duty to pray and study, and pray and study until you know which is the Church the Lord built.

I would highly recommend the little book, "The Trail of Blood," by J. M. Carroll to every Baptist in the world and I wish that every Catholic, Protestant and Jew would read it and believe it too.
